



ITEC Programme at NIBM gets Overwhelming response

International Programme on Banking and Finance with special focus on Credit Management and International Trade Finance sponsored by Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India, under the Indian Technical and Economic Cooperation Programme (ITEC), was inaugurated by Dr. K L Dhingra, Director, National Institute of Bank Management, at its campus in Pune. The two-week duration training programme commenced from March 2nd and will conclude on March 14, 2020.

In his inaugural address to the participants, Dr. Dhingra highlighted the importance of the Indian Technical and Economic Cooperation Programme (ITEC), present banking scenario of the Indian banking industry and various activities of NIBM.

In all, there are 38 participants from 18 different countries viz. Afghanistan, CIS countries, the Middle East, SAARC countries, Southeast Asia, Africa, and the South American region.

NIBM has been attracting a large number of overseas participants in its various training programmes. Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India has also increased ITEC programmes to be conducted at NIBM from six to seven, this year which is the highest ever. In addition, NIBM has conducted training programmes overseas, at the doorstep of banks in Nepal, Bhutan, and the Maldives. Perhaps, NIBM is the only institute in the country, recognized by the Ministry of External Affairs, to cater to the banking-related training needs of the Asian, African, East European and South American regions. By the end of the current financial year, NIBM expects to train more than 1100 foreign participants which will be the highest number so far.
